Vienna

The crown jewel of Central Europe is home to the Spanish Riding School, St. Stephen's Cathedral and the museums of the Hofburg.

Prague

Where narrow streets wind round an Old Town Square and the world's most fascinating clock keeps time with the city. This is Prague, "the City of a Hundred Spires." A place where travelers come to count the dozens of statues atop an ancient bridge and sip coffee in the cloak-and-dagger world of cafes.
